them will be the upcoming band, Verona Grove.

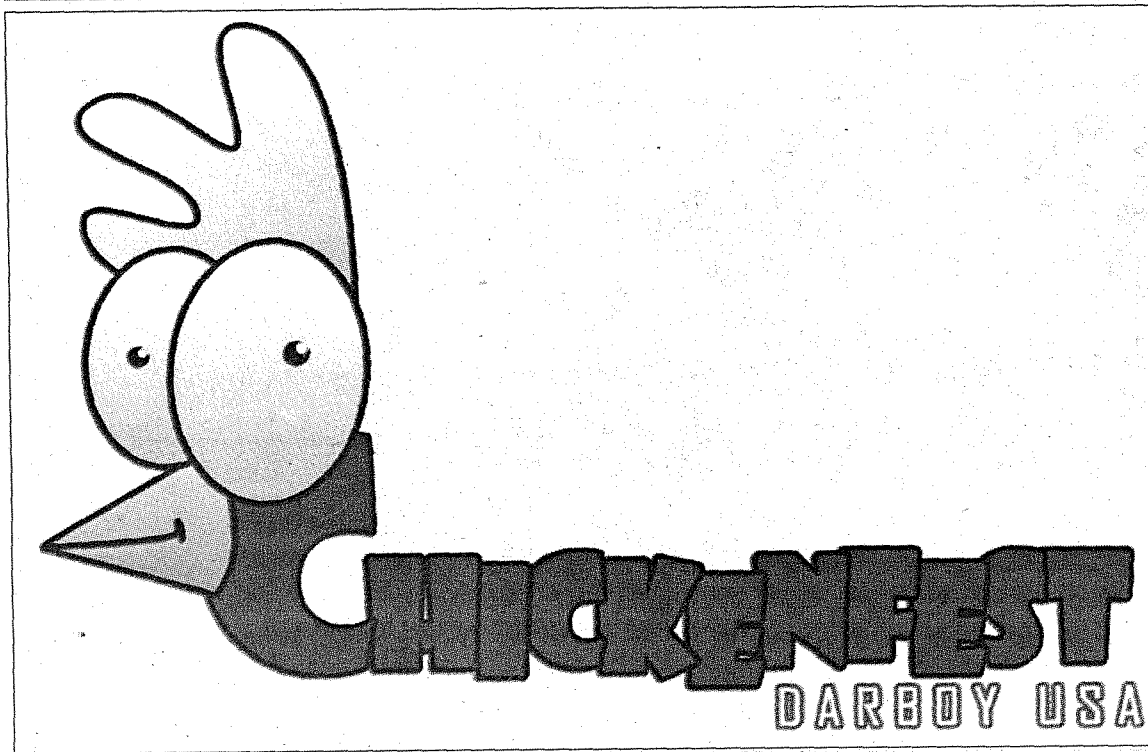
They have a national entertainer coming from Orlando for a new family show featuring Bubble Nicholas, The Marionette, who will perform on Saturday from 1:30-2:30.

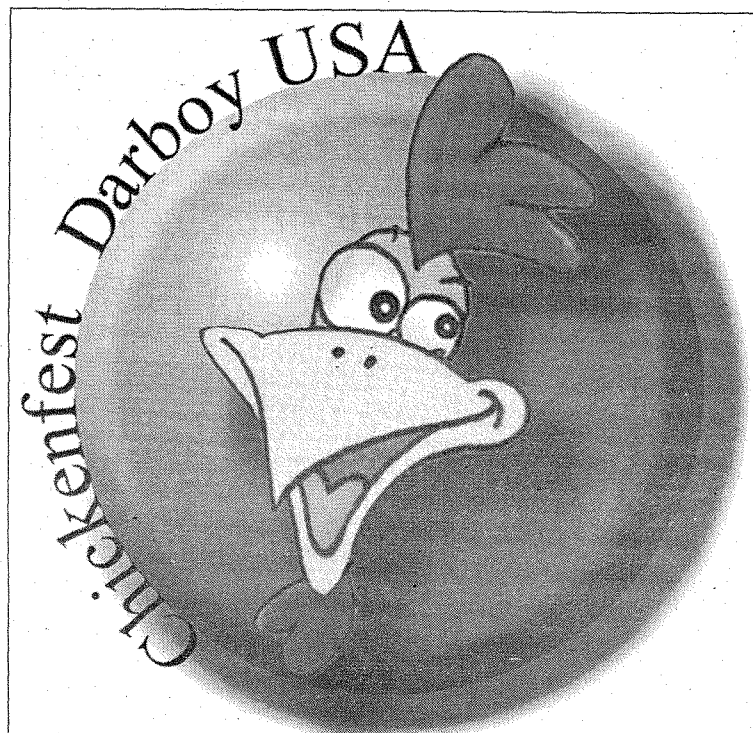
